

Rector's Note

People in every community care about something. The most important asset in any community is people's willingness to act on what they care about. Care brings people together for common purpose. Care is a song that flows through every community and those who want to develop stronger communities must know how to recognize it and harmonize with it. The song of community becomes more audible to leaders willing to ask simple questions and listen thoughtfully to the answers:

- What do you care about?
- What will you do about that?

When the song of care is clearly heard, people find the power to act together. Those who want to help often try to get community members to do things that helper's think they should do, based on the helper's problem analysis. If, as often happens, the helpers find no responses they conclude that citizens don't care. They apply labels like "unmotivated," "in denial," and "at risk" to a place because they can't hear the song of community there. But the reality is different. People not caring about what others want them to care about is a different kind of problem from people not caring. Some conclude that no one cares, but in twenty-five years of community work I have never seen a community where people don't care about something! When communities are not responsive to a particular agenda, this does not mean that people do not care. It is more a problem of poor listening to the community than a problem of low motivation in the community.

Mike Green:

When People Care Enough to Act, 55-56.

This quotation from Mike Green is his description of the Song of Community. I began working with Mike while I was implementing work outlined in General Convention resolution 2009-A155 as a Program Officer of our church. Ironically, I had to move to the metropolitan New York City area to meet a neighbor...literally from my neighborhood in Denver. Mike is even an Episcopalian! What stands out most to me from this particular quote is its message of profound optimism. Everyone cares about something! I helped Mike introduce Asset Based Community Development thinking to a number of dioceses through the Jubilee Ministry network. My role often included translating this message into the vernacular of our congregations so that leadership could make some connections with their own challenges. As I see it, the challenge before the church is not declining membership and corresponding decreases in financial giving. Those are merely symptoms. The challenge is whether we, as an institutional body of people who gather regularly for worship, are willing to listen to one

another talk about the things we care most about and to invite other people who do not attend our churches to do the same.

One of the aims of the 1979 Book of Common Prayer was its emphasis on establishing vibrant, empowered ministries among the laity along with a corresponding reduction of clerical dependency. I am not sure if there exist many, if any, models of this imagined Episcopal Community. But I do know that our shift in a congregational leadership model from one of "Father knows best" to one of an empowered laity is only part of the shift we need to make. I suspect we here at All Saints have made/ are making that shift well, but the other half is that which Mike Green intimates. That is: while we might be better in touch with making necessary adaptations to secure the interests of our own cares; the health of our congregation depends upon our willingness and ability to listen for and discover what it is that other people care about with the same vigor we use to pursue our own cares.

What would it look like if we truly sought to love our neighbor as we love ourselves? I suspect that when we hear the song of community as Mike describes we will know.

Hepatitis A vaccine

Second Dose Information--

The Oakland County Health Department ("OCHD") came to All Saints' on June 9th and 11th to administer the first dose for the Hepatitis A vaccine. At that time it was mentioned that this is a "2-step" vaccine meaning that a second dose could be given 6 months from the time of the administration of the first dose. That time is now here, December 9th and 11th.

Fortunately, the OCHD was able to administer the first dose free of charge. I have been in contact with the OCHD throughout the fall with hopes that the second dose would also be able to be administered free of charge. Unfortunately that is not the case. Although the second dose is recommended, you are 95% protected with the one single dose. Please read the following information regarding how to obtain the second dose of this vaccine if you are wanting to do so.
